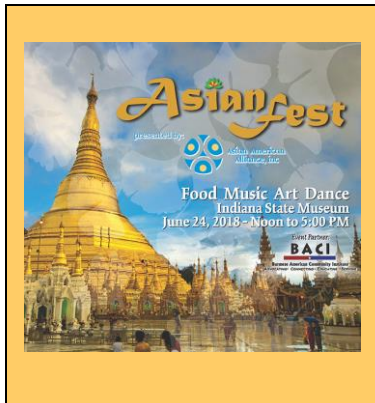

For many Burmese, the U.S. has become their home and country of refuge. There are 14,000 est. Burmese who have settled in the Indianapolis area, primarily on the south side as well as on the north side. Burmese make up 75 percent of the refugees placed by Exodus Refugee Immigration, Inc.
